

Paul writes to Timothy “if we are faithless, He will remain faithful, for He cannot disown Himself.” Here is one of the many examples of this truth in the well known account of Jesus calming the storm.

³⁵ That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, “Let us go over to the other side.”

³⁶ Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. ³⁷ A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. ³⁸ Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, “Teacher, don’t you care if we drown?”





- Bring a monetary gift. These gifts will go into a fund for the Elders to use when people request assistance with food or gasoline.






