Focus for Our Worship

To whom does the work of salvation belong? Simple answer: Jesus! But this is how good Jesus is. So that our lives might have profound meaning and eternal purpose, he calls us not just to be followers, but to be follower-makers. Jesus asks some—prophets, apostles, pastors, missionaries, teachers—to do this full time. But ultimately Jesus asks all believers to serve as his ambassadors, sharing the gospel with whomever he brings into our sphere of influence. This lofty charge requires commitment—a willingness to abandon everything else should faithfulness require it. This is the life-changing revelation ("aha moment!") for this week in the Epiphany season.

A READING FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT

Jonah 3:1-10

The reluctant Jonah had been given the lofty charge of proclaiming a message from the LORD to the people of Nineveh.

Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: ²"Get up. Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you."

³So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh just as the word of the LORD had commanded. Now Nineveh was a great city to God. It required a three-day walk. ⁴Jonah walked through the city for a day, and he called out, "Forty more days and Nineveh is going to be overthrown!"


⁵The men of Nineveh believed God. They proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least. ⁶When word reached the king of Nineveh, he got up from his throne, took off his royal robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. ⁷Then he issued a proclamation in Nineveh.

By the decree of the king and his leading officials:

Do not let people or animals, herds or flocks, taste anything. Do not let them eat food or drink water. ⁸Instead, let people and animals be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call fervently to God. Let them turn from their evil way and from the violence that is in their hands. ⁹Who knows? God may turn and relent. He may turn from his burning anger so that we will not perish.

¹⁰When God saw their actions, that they had turned from their evil way, God relented from the disaster which he said he would bring on them, and he did not carry it out.



A READING FROM ONE OF THE FOUR GOSPELS (Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John) Mark 1:14-20 When Jesus gave Simon and Andrew the lofty charge of fishing for people, they left everything else behind.

¹⁴After John was put in prison, Jesus went to Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God. ¹⁵"The time is fulfilled," he said. "The kingdom of God has come near! Repent, and believe in the gospel."

¹⁶As Jesus was going along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea, since they were fishermen. ¹⁷Jesus said to them, "Come, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." ¹⁸Immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹Going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat mending the nets. ²⁰Immediately Jesus called them. They left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him.




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

¹⁶As a result, from now on, we regard no one according to the flesh. (We now view people differently than the world views them...they are dear _____.) Even though we knew Christ according to the flesh, we no longer know him that way.

¹⁸And all these things are from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. ¹⁹That is, God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them. And he has entrusted to us the message of reconciliation. ²⁰Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, inasmuch as God is making an appeal through us. We urge you, on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God.

Jesus died as the substitute for all people (verse 15). When he died on the cross, as true God and true man in one person, he was reconciling the whole world. The phrase not counting is an appositive to the previous phrase reconciling the whole world. It explains that reconciling the world means forgiving their sins. Christ paid for all the sins of all the people, and the Father accepted that payment. This teaching is called world reconciliation, universal justification, general justification, or objective justification. Believers receive the benefits of this reconciliation/justification by faith in Christ. Unbelievers reject Jesus as their Savior, and as a result forfeit the blessings that Christ won for them. To be reconciled to God here means to believe in Jesus as Savior and to receive by faith what Jesus has won. It means enjoying the peace which God created for us. Paul is not teaching universalism (the false teaching that everyone will go to heaven). Only believers in Jesus receive eternal life.


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
