### FIRST LESSON — Micah 7:15-20

*The Holy Lord assures us of His forgiveness of all the sins which we have committed against Him on the basis of the sacrificial death of the Messiah (and thereby empowers us to relay His forgiveness to others).*

## SECOND LESSON — Philippians 1:3-11

*The Apostle Paul here urges the members of the Church of Christ to a loving fellowship which necessarily implies mutual forgiveness (in opposition to the selfish flesh) and reassures us of the forgiveness won by Christ and dispensed through His Word and Sacraments which empowers us to forgive.*

<sup>3</sup> I thank my God every time I remember you. <sup>4</sup> In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy <sup>5</sup> because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, <sup>6</sup> being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

<sup>7</sup> It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart; for whether I am in chains or defending and confirming the gospel, all of you share in God's grace with me.

<sup>8</sup> God can testify how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus.

<sup>9</sup> And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, <sup>10</sup> so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ, <sup>11</sup> filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God.

## HOLY GOSPEL — Matthew 18:23-35

### Sermon Text

<sup>23</sup> “Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants.

<sup>24</sup> As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him.

<sup>25</sup> Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt.

<sup>26</sup> “The servant fell on his knees before him. ‘Be patient with me,’ he begged, ‘and I will pay back everything.’ <sup>27</sup> The servant’s master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go.

<sup>28</sup> “But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii. He grabbed him and began to choke him. ‘Pay back what you owe me!’ he demanded.

<sup>29</sup> “His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, ‘Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.’

<sup>30</sup> “But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. <sup>31</sup> When the other servants saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed and went and told their master everything that had happened.

<sup>32</sup> “Then the master called the servant in. ‘You wicked servant,’ he said, ‘I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. <sup>33</sup> Shouldn’t you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?’ <sup>34</sup> In anger his master turned him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.

<sup>35</sup> “This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother from your heart.”

**Scripture Storytelling** – On Friday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, our school children will have an opportunity to hear and see something unique. But what I love about Scripture Storytelling, and the reason it's so powerful to me also as I share it, is that God's Word IS alive, active and dynamic with God's presence and power; I'm just putting that character of God's Word on display in proclamation."* **Parents and everyone from the St. Paul's church family, you are welcome to join us for this special event on Friday, November 16<sup>th</sup> beginning at 8:30 a.m. at church.** *"My goal is to put the memory treasures of God's Word on display,"* Daniel says, *"to show children the possibilities with memory work, that it isn't a dull thing, but a dynamic blessing when you're working with God's living and active Word."* Daniel will be sharing *Jonah*, portions of *Luke*, and more. Come and experience the power and drama of God's Word!
